The goal of this course is to engage Master's students in a series of professional development activities and to develop skills that promote professional success during their studies and after graduation. Students will participate in a series of presentations (e.g., brown bag, colloquia, symposia) taking place outside of the department as well as organized by the department where speakers share their latest research in linguistics and offer a series of focused workshops.

COURSE DESIGN: MAJOR ASSIGNMENTS AND ASSESSMENTS

Students will be required to engage in a required number of class sessions, online courses, and in person events. Students will submit a short reflection paper after each online or in person event. For informational workshops, the report should include two

questions that didn't get answered. For research presentations, the report should include a critique or statement of limitations.

GRADING POLICIES

The grade for this course will be based on attendance and participation in at least five class sessions (40%), four online courses/lectures (40%), and two real-world events (20%). At least one of the events must be a research presentation (e.g., a department colloquium). Alternate arrangements can be made if needed to work around student schedules.
