This course serves as an introduction to the study of syntax within the Lexical-Functional Grammar (LFG), a lexicalist constraint-based grammar framework.. We will explore a number of phenomena of natural language morphosyntax in a variety of typologically diverse languages. Topics to be covered include relative and interrogative clauses, auxiliaries and clause structure, mixed category constructions, and computational grammars.
